In the Name of God Amen I William Ladner of the parish of Madron in the County of Cornwall Yeoman being weak in body but of sound mind and memory and hoping to be ready when God shall be pleased to call me hence do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and bequeath in the following manner that is to say First I give and bequeath unto my Son Charles the Inn or Public House situate in Newlyn in the parish of Paul and now in the occupation of my Daughter Jane Carter he to pay off whatever debts may be thereon at the time of my decease Secondly I give and bequeath unto my Sons Charles and James my Leasehold Estate of Tregiffan in the parish of St. Buryan now in the occupation of William Paddy Jeffery Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my Son James the dwelling house adjoining the aforesaid Inn or Public House in Newlyn aforesaid and now in the occupation of John Kneebone he to pay the debt that may be thereon at the time of my decease and also to pay unto each my daughters except Mary the sum of Fifteen pounds the said sum of Fifteen pounds to be paid to each within twelve months after my decease Lastly I make and ordain my Sons Charles and James the joint Executors of this my last Will and Testament and I hereby revoke disannul and make void all and every former Will, Wills or bequests by me in any ways before willed or bequeathed ratifying and confirming this as my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have fixed my hand and seal this tenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and forty seven
